

## Dear Parent/Carer

Year 11 Mock Exam series 1 – Monday 11th November to Thursday 21st November 2019

During the weeks commencing 11<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> November, Year 11 students will be sitting a programme of mock GCSE exams for English, Maths, Science and their option subjects. These mock exams will form part of the second round of monitoring. Mock exams in English, Maths, Science, and Humanities have been externally set for use in all schools across the Multi Academy Trust. This will help moderate and standardise the grades awarded, giving students, parents and teachers a valid and accurate picture of current progress. Students will be made aware of the timetable of mock exams this week; the timetable will also be posted on the school website: Year Groups/Year 11/Revision and displayed outside the Main Hall.

Teachers for all subjects will be making students aware of how and on what content they will be assessed in the lead up to the mock exams; however included below is a summary of the assessments for the Core, Ebacc and option subjects along with how students can best prepare for these.

Please can I take this opportunity to remind parents/carers of the after school revision session provision that is available Monday to Friday and to encourage students to engage at home with the suggested preparation highlighted below.

English Lang / Lit:	
What topics and learning will the mock exams cover?	English Language - Paper 2 English Literature – 'Romeo and Juliet' and 'A Christmas Carol'
What form will the mock exam take?	2 x 1 hour 45 minute exams
What materials have been provided to assist students' preparations?	Students will have a practice paper 2 for English Language to complete at home and they will have a range of flash cards and revision materials for 'Romeo and Juliet' and 'A Christmas Carol'
How could students be supported in their preparations at home?	They need to complete the English Language Paper 2 under timed conditions. They could be tested on memorised quotations and explain to parents what they will write about each quotation.

Maths	
What topics and learning will the mock exams cover?	The whole of the KS4 programme of study
What form will the mock exam take?	3 papers (1 non-calculator, 2 calculator) each 1.5hrs in duration.
What materials have been provided to assist students' preparations?	To help students revise the topics they need to, all students have been issued with a 'Corbett Maths' list of topics, which all have a You Tube video attached. Students can buy a revision guide from school/'Amazon'/'WH Smiths', as well as using their books to revise from.
How could students be supported in their preparations at home?	'Seneca' <a href="https://www.senecalearning.com/blog/gcse-maths-revision/">https://www.senecalearning.com/blog/gcse-maths-revision/</a> and 'BBC Bitesize' <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/subjects/z38pycw">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/subjects/z38pycw</a> offer the entire programme of study to help support students revising at home.

Science	
What topics and learning will the mock exams cover?	Biology, Chemistry and Physics papers 1 topics. This is usually the first 4 sections in the revision books the students have been provided with.
What form will the mock exam take?	3 papers (combined 75 minutes Triple 105 minutes) A mixture of tick box, short answer 1 or 2 mark questions and longer answer 3 or 4 mark questions with at least one extended 6 mark question
What materials have been provided to assist students' preparations?	Revision guides, revision packs with revision cards have been provided to students for their use at home. Completed homework booklets with example questions are also available to students. Students are also able to complete sections set on SENECA <a href="https://www.senecalearning.com/">https://www.senecalearning.com/</a> ; students already have their log in details.

How could students be supported
in their preparations at home?

Encourage use of the SENECA learning website. Check revision cards and quiz the students on their recall. Ensure that they have completed the homework tasks from this half term as these link specifically to the mock exam topics.

History	
What topics and learning will the mock exams cover?	Health and the people, Norman England and Weimar and Nazi Germany
What form will the mock exam take?	There is an hour paper for each of the three modules they have covered so far. Two of the modules will be sat at the same time in a two hour block and then there will be a further one hour block. This will be the same format as the mock exam taken at the end of Year 10.
What materials have been provided to assist students' preparations?	Revision guides (letters sent out to parents last week), BBC Bitesize <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/subjects/zj26n39">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/subjects/zj26n39</a> , their exercise books and revision maps that we have given to students previously.
How could students be supported in their preparations at home?	Encourage students to use revision websites/guides, complete revision homework which is set. Discuss their mock exam postcard with them to help them focus on what they need to do to improve.

Geography	
What topics and learning will the mock exams cover?	There will be two papers.  • A full Paper 1 – Living with the Physical Environment (Section A, B and C)  • Paper 2 – Challenges of the Human Environment (section A and B – followed by a fieldwork question from Paper 3)
What form will the mock exam take?	Both papers are 90 minutes long with a range of question tariffs from 1 mark through to 9 mark assess and evaluate questions. Students should be familiar with these questions.
What materials have been provided to assist students' preparations?	Books can go home and the summer homework was to complete revision notes for paper 1. How could students be supported in their preparations at home?	Students should focus on revising case studies and key areas of weakness. We are looking to see a big improvement in Paper 1 – especially Rivers and Coasts.

What form will the mock exam take?	Spanish GCSE past questions on Theme 1, 2 and 3 – Writing, Listening and Reading skills. GCSE Themes 1 and 2 for speaking. Please note due to speaking exams requiring one to one time, students will complete the speaking exams the week commencing 25th November. Students will be told the specific times and dates of their speaking exam in lesson time.	
What materials have been provided to assist students' preparations?	Students will have 2 revision lessons before the exam detailing what to revise and how to best do this. They will also have exemplar questions for practise. All revision material needed is in student exercise books. This also provides a range of practise materials on Theme 1 and 2 in all skills.  The speaking exams require the students to have learnt their own answers to the Theme 1 and 2 questions. The photo cards will also be focussing on Theme 1 and 2	
How could students be supported in their preparations at home?	Time and space for revision. Access to the interest encourage students to revise their Theme 1 answers could also help students to memorise students need to revise all work from Y9 and	se their answers. Please be aware that

What topics and learning will the mock exams cover?	All content from the entire course
What form will the mock exam take?	2 papers, 90mins each. Each paper is worth 80 marks
What materials have been provided to assist students' preparations?	Remember to use your issues revision flash cards and make use of the blue revision guide. Ensure that all revision involves elements of questioning and marking. We have revised most of unit 1 but there are clear areas of unit 2 that will not have been revised so consider this when you revise.
How could students be supported in their preparations at home?	Use the issued revision flash cards which have questions on one side and the answers on the other. Encourage them to redo old micro tests to maximise their retention of important theory.

What topics and learning will the mock exams cover?	The mock exam with cover all 4 learning outcomes that will be assessed in the formal external exam in January 2020.  LO1: User Groups & Barriers / Factors Affecting Popularity of Sports  LO2: Values of Sport & The Olympic Movement  LO3: Major Sports Events  LO4: National Governing Bodies and their roles.
What form will the mock exam take?	The assessment in a single 1 hour exam. Questions range from multiple choice 1 mark questions, through to shorter written answers worth between 2 and 6 marks and a final long answer question worth 8 marks.
What materials have been provided to assist students' preparations?	Students have been working through the exam content in lessons since September. They will also be issued with knowledge organisers and revisions sheets for the 4 learning outcomes they will be questioned on.
How could students be supported in their preparations at home?	Parents could interact with their child using the knowledge organiser and revision sheets. We have given focus in lessons to learning outcome 1 and 2 in particular so recapping this would be useful as it is a large component of previous formal exam papers.
